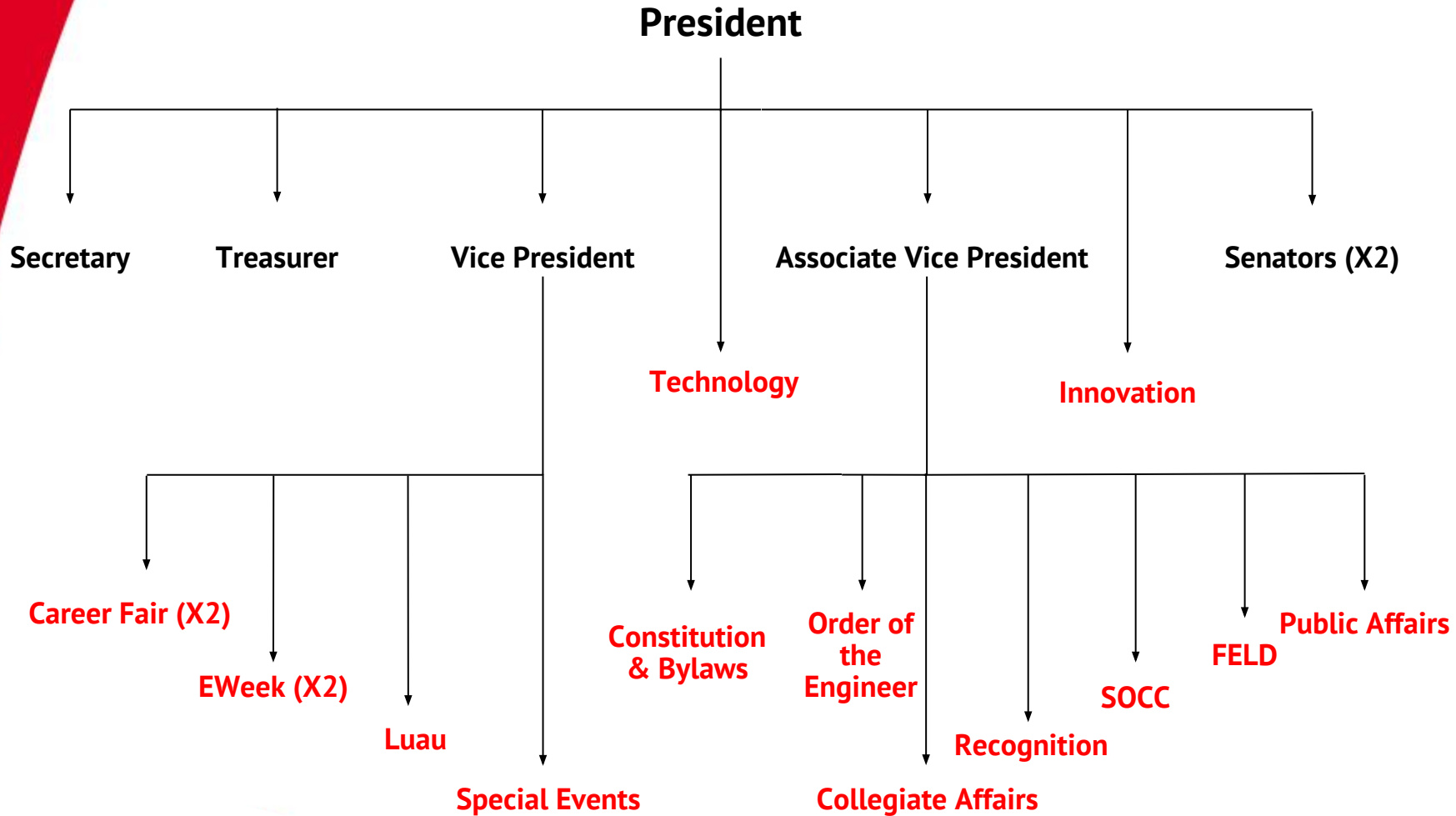


Senator Report

- Karl Scheer (Chief Investment Officer) came to Senate to discuss effects of divestment on endowment
- Enactment Bills – Referendums, Defining Student Government Membership
- Appropriation Bills (SG Retreat, SGMP Pad folios, EFC Attire)

What we learned about Divestment

- Endowment ~ \$1.2 Billion was donated to UC
- Endowment is split into 3 main sections (Fund A, Fund “Other”, Privately Owned)
 - To Switch Fund A – minimal difficulty to divest but cost to manage increases
 - To switch Fund “Other” – no path of divestment – will require more man-hours (cost) to devise solution
 - Privately Owned – will require cost to divest – up to \$1.6 Million (**May not be effected by Fossil Free UC mission**)
- Path to Divestment
 1. A discussion will be held that is public and transparent
 2. Investment Committee (Appointed by the Board) votes
- Donor base has historically been upset when political statements are made with endowment.
- It was confirmed that A company threatened to pull co-op jobs out if divestment did occur – we have reason to believe that this is Marathon
